INTERMEDIATE CROCHET CLASS

APRIL 12 & 19

1 TO 3 PM

This month you have your choice of two projects, you get to pick! The first project is a boot topper cuff that fits inside the top of your boot. You will need - a soft yarn, such as Red Heart soft or any #4 yarn and a crochet Hook Size J. You may need to bring an I hook & a K hook depending on how you crochet. This will be needed to check your gauge. Project 2 is: a wiggle trivet. It is done in beautiful colors and is 3D. You will need several colors of cotton dishcloth yarn, from 2 to 9 colors. We will start with a plain color base. So bring 1 plain color and a G hook. Then we can decide on the other colors. Again if you think you will need other sizes of hooks please bring an F & and an H hook also.

May is for flowers so we are making flower coasters that will also help us learn to crochet in the round. You can make them in different colors or all the same & they make great gifts. Supplies: a ball or several scraps of cotton dish cloth yarn, a size G hook, a stitch marker and a yarn needle. Please bring extra hooks if you crochet tighter or looser. These will get done quickly so bring your unfinished projects to finish.
