## REPORTS AND COMMENTS

MAYOR JENSEN thanked Council for their cooperation with the Administration this year as it looks like most of the road programs will be completed before school starts, which may be a first. He said he appreciates them all working together to be able to get these projects going. Mayor Jensen advised the rain slowed things down a bit with the Main Street and Middle Road project, but the contractors will be working hard this next week and maybe even get a layer of blacktop down by the end of this week. He said he believes the Cherry Street, Pear Street, Willo Road and Jennie Street resurfacing projects were finishing up as well as the area by Northgate on Carleen Avenue and Old Colorado Avenue.

Mayor Jensen stated the restroom project at Northgate Park would be getting underway soon. He advised the Chester Road widening project would also be getting underway soon. Mayor Jensen thanked City Council again for working together and they were able to get the bids out early and he believes most of the residents are happy about the improvements.

Mayor Jensen said he received calls from residents thanking him and City Council when they read the article in the paper regarding the parklands that the City purchased, for continuing to take some areas out of development and keep them wooded. Mayor Jensen stated he has also received positive feedback regarding the cooperation between the Schools and the City to add the new pickle ball and tennis courts. He said when he was at the new courts recently comments were made to him that the courts were very professional looking, and they were very thankful that the City and the Schools could work together and have a college-type atmosphere at those courts.

## COUNCIL MEMBERS:

MRS. DEMALINE, WARD 1, advised in the most recent Avon Community Guide there was information about the Traxler property. She asked Mayor Jensen if he could provide some information as to where the City is at with that property and when the City will be able to use it as public property.

Mayor Jensen advised they are hoping to close on the purchase of that property before the end of this year, but the property is under contract. He said Mr. Cummins may be able to provide more insight into where we are in the process as there is grant money available that they hope to take advantage of in the closing process.

Mr. Cummins advised over the past week he has been interacting with a member of Ohio Public Works Commission. He said the OPWC is currently working on finalizing the grant agreement that will let those grant dollars flow and allow the City to close on the property and get reimbursed. Mr. Cummins stated they are working on that currently and expect that to move forward in the next couple of months and have it close before the end of July.

Mrs. Demaline advised she is so pleased to see the progress on the sidewalks that she has noticed being installed around the City, which leads her back to the overall sidewalk plan. She said in a previous Service Committee Meeting they asked the Administration to put together a comprehensive plan to show what they will be looking at going into 2024 and beyond. Mrs. Demaline asked if they were anywhere near having that ready where a Service Committee Meeting should be called soon.

Mayor Jensen advised that he believes that should come about over the next two months. He said one thing they wanted to see was how well the program was working. He said a lot of property owners

are taking it upon themselves to install their sidewalks on their own. Mayor Jensen stated there are a few properties along French Creek Road where they have installed sidewalks. He talked to a resident the other day that told him they want the City to install their sidewalk and he wants to make sure everything is in place on our end to do that to get it done as soon as possible. Mayor Jensen said he is surprised at some of the property owners who went ahead and took the initiative to install their own sidewalk especially on Colorado Avenue as those property owners even cleaned up the area and that is a positive. He stated he would try to give Council a better date next week, but he felt they would be prepared to move forward in the next two months. Mayor Jensen advised if Council knows of some areas they would like to be on the next sidewalk improvement area listing to let him know and they will be preparing a list of the ones they believe can get accomplished fairly easily and then there will be some that are more challenging.

Mrs. Demaline advised the May 31<sup>st</sup> deadline is quickly approaching for residents to have those sidewalks installed. She asked when the City would be moving in to take care of installing sidewalks on their behalf.

Mayor Jensen advised the residents who have already told the City that they want the City to install their sidewalks. Hopefully the City will get started on installing those after that deadline passes. He said the property owners who have not contacted the City, the City will probably wait until July 1<sup>st</sup> and then begin that process. Mayor Jensen stated there is a contractor that has indicated he is available and hopefully he can get started on July 1<sup>st</sup> and as soon as June 1<sup>st</sup> for those who have already let the City know that they want the City to install their sidewalks.

Mrs. Demaline advised she looks forward to talking about when they should schedule the next Service Committee Meeting to continue the progress. She thanked Mayor Jensen for his support on that issue.

MRS. HOLTZMEIER, AT LARGE, clarified that regarding the joint Committee Meeting of both Finance and Legal that was held tonight prior to the start of this Regular Meeting, apparently when it is a joint committee meeting and there are members who serve on both committees they do not have to vote twice; once was good enough in the affirmative. Mrs. Holtzmeier stated officially the motion was approved by both the Finance and the Legal Committees and she wanted to make that clarification for the record.

Mrs. Holtzmeier reported that she would be out of town next Monday and will not be present for the Work Session on May 15<sup>th</sup>.

MR. MCBRIDE, WARD 2, thanked the Administration for the paving projects on and near Colorado Avenue as well as the sidewalks on Colorado Avenue. He said hopefully the one resident was satisfied with the paving even though the street was still in pretty smooth condition, but it had heavy alligator cracking prior to being paved.

Mayor Jensen advised the resident called and thanked the Administration.

Mr. McBride inquired if the City removed any illegally posted signs this week. He proposed increasing the fines for violators as it was getting ridiculous.

Mr. Streator advised a number of signs were removed last week and there were a large number of signs posted by a company on the corner of SR 83 and Detroit Road regarding a public auction and those were removed quickly. He said they were utilizing more personnel to remove signs and it does take a little more effort to get the ones taken down that are posted on utility poles, but he felt they were succeeding. Mr. Streator agreed they are an eyesore, and they try to get out there as quickly as possible both by the Zoning Enforcement Officer and the Community Service Officers in the Police Department.

Mr. McBride advised he would love to see those entities fined that posted the public auction signs and those signs that are posted in what he would consider the I-90 ROW as they are contained within the City of Avon and he felt they could be legally cited. He indicated the City needed to write fines for those

out of the area businesses that come through and bombard the City with fliers in the ROW and the utility poles.

Mr. Streator advised there was only a phone number listed on the signage, so it was difficult to track anyone down.

MR. MOORE, WARD 3, said he would support imposing fines for violators of placing signs in the public right of way. He stated they were getting free advertising and he felt the City might as well make them pay for that advertising. Mr. Moore advised the signs in the right of way and on the utility poles was a look he would prefer not to see in our City. He understood it is a constant battle and he felt the Zoning Enforcement Officer does a wonderful job of grabbing those signs as they pop-up, but he is all for citing the offenders.

MR. RADCLIFFE, WARD 4, asked Mayor Jensen for an update on the concrete repair work in some of the neighborhoods.

Mayor Jensen advised he met with Mr. Streator and Mr. Loeser, the Superintendent of Streets, to discuss it and they do have contractors lined up and they should be getting started possibly as early as next week. He said there is a total of over 40 catch basins that need to be replaced. Mayor Jensen stated they would be getting those replaced over time based on what they can reasonably get accomplished using one contractor. He advised there is another contractor that will be doing the street repair work. Mayor Jensen felt they would focus on a specific area and get that area done and then move on to the next area. He said some of the cul-de-sac areas are also on the top of the list to get fixed.

Mr. Radcliffe said it sounds like a big improvement to have two contractors working on it this summer and he thanked Mayor Jensen.

MR. WITHERSPOON, AT LARGE, had no comments.

MR. FISCHER, AT LARGE, had no comments.
