

ORDINANCE NO. 52-16

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT APPROPRIATIONS
ORDINANCE NO. 150-15 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, certain funds within the amount appropriated in Ordinance No. 150-15 do not meet the estimated operational expenses; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AVON, LORAIN COUNTY, OHIO:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 150-15 be amended, supplemented and reappropriated as indicated on the attached Exhibit, which is made a part of this Ordinance by reference.

Section 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Avon, the immediate emergency being the necessity and desirability of establishing a provision of funds for the expenditures for the fiscal year 2016 in order to maintain an efficient City operation; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by this Council and approval by the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 52-16

Special Revenue Funds

Police Department Equipment Fund (220)

Appropriate \$20,000.00 for a new cruiser (Tahoe) to replace one that was totaled in an accident. The City was reimbursed \$20,910.40 for damage to the vehicle.

Appropriate \$8,200.00 for 20 weapon sighting systems to replace some that were found to be faulty. The manufacturer reimbursed the City \$8,178.31 for these 20 systems.

Total Police Department Equipment Fund (220) \$28,200.00

Police Department Fund (221)

Decrease appropriations for Part-time wages (\$18,740.80) to offset the increase in appropriations below.

Appropriate \$18,740.80 for “de-obligation” of the 2014-2015 Drug Use Prevention Grant for School Resource Officers. This money is to be returned to the Ohio Attorney General’s Office because the program did not meet enough of drug use prevention education hours. The Avon Schools will pay for one-half of this expense.

Stadium Highway Marquee Fund (284)

Appropriate \$48,919.00 for painting of portions of the All-Pro Freight Stadium.

Total Special Revenue Funds \$77,119.00

Capital Project Funds

Reigelsberger Road Bridge Fund (438)

Appropriate \$7,503.05 for contractor’s payments that the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) made directly to them. We have recorded the same amount as revenue in this fund, which represents a portion of the grant the City was awarded for this project through OPWC.

Total Capital Project Funds Re-appropriations \$7,503.05

Total Re-appropriations all funds \$84,622.05
