

ORDINANCE NO. 20-19

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 1064 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF
THE CITY OF AVON TO INCREASE FEES FOR USE OF PARK FIELDS,
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Recreation Coordinator have reviewed the language and rental rates for the Park Facilities; and

WHEREAS, due to increases in operating expenses for these facilities it was determined that the fees charged in Chapter 1064 should be increased; and

WHEREAS, Council as a whole, having reviewed said amendments, also finds them to be appropriate and in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Avon and desires to amend Chapter 1064 as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
AVON, LORAIN COUNTY, OHIO:**

Section 1 - That the provisions of Chapter 1064 pertaining to Parks shall be amended to read as set forth in the new Chapter 1064 attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit "A" which is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2 - The Codifier is hereby instructed to insert the amendments into Chapter 1064 as contained in this legislation. All other language contained in Chapter 1064 not specifically amended herein shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3 - That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4 - That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Avon, the immediate emergency being the necessity to amend Chapters 1064 to provide for increases in fees for the park facilities before the start of outdoor activities this Spring and Summer; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
